

Year 6 Spring Project Overview – Wolves

Big Idea: What are wolves?

HOOK: Children explore what it means to be an author and how to create character during an author visit from Sarah Lean.

OUTCOME: Children create trailers for their books.

Applied Literacy:

Children communicate their scientific and geographical knowledge in discursive information texts.

Children create a character synopsis whilst developing their wolf character.

Pupil Premium Curriculum Enhancement:

Children receive a talk about wolves from experts from The New Forest Wildlife Park.

Literacy: Children will develop their own wolf character by creating their backstory, appearance and personality. They then write the first chapter of a narrative weaving character, setting and plot together seamlessly.

Geography: Biomes - children explore where wolves can be found in the world. They interpret layered maps to explore the biomes that wolves live in and compare different biomes.

Science: Biology - wolves - children research wolves, learn that fossils can show us about the history of the wolf and understand that the process of evolution and inheritance has led to the different species of wolves we have today.

Art: Sculpture - In this journey children explore the work of Mark Holme and his sculptures of animals made from wire. They develop their own techniques of wire sculpting to create their own additive wire sculpture of their wolf character.
