To Be Curious - Progression of learning

Whole School assembly to introduce: <u>To Be Curious</u> What does it mean to be curious?

Whole school home learning in Week 1 - send home questions and aims, ask all chn to prepare something

From week 3, Year groups to use morning work, circle times, class assemblies or a morning or afternoon to explore their year group questions in a speed-dating format so that each child gets to work with **several different children**. Children complete a <u>worksheet</u> for each other child they talk to, to be stuck into PSHE books (Y5 going digital instead).

Year groups can steer the questions or the focus towards whatever is a current issue for your children
