## Safeguarding

If you are Christmas Shopping and thinking about purchasing online or computer games for your children, please be aware of the age appropriate games that are on offer to you.

#### Game 'age ratings' explained

#### What do game ratings mean?

To help you choose age-appropriate games for children most platforms will feature an age rating on the game. Due to the way certain platforms categorise games according to their content, at times the age rating for one game may not be the same across all platforms. So, it can be confusing when taking a call on whether a game is age-appropriate. However, you can set <u>parental controls</u> on your games console to limit what content your child accesses.

#### Choosing age-appropriate games

It's important to pay attention to the age minimums for the video games your child plays. However, there is sometimes contradicting information. For example, Clash of Clans is rated Everyone 10+ on the Google Play app store, but Supercell – the makers of the game – have set the minimum age of the game to 13 and over because it features a chat function and inapp purchasing.

Therefore, it is important to understand what the ratings mean and why these may have been categorised in this way.

#### How are games rated under PEGI?

All games released in the UK will have one of the following PEGI age ratings on the packaging: 3, 7, 12, 16 or 18. The rating means that the game shouldn't be played by a young person under that age.

Why? Because there may be content within the game which could potentially be harmful, frightening or worrying to children. As well as an age rating, PEGI also uses icons showing content descriptors, letting you know if a game contains: violence, drugs, bad language, discrimination, fear, gambling, sex, or in-app purchases.

## Carbon Monoxide Awareness Week!



Many households are at an increased risk of carbon monoxide poisoning this winter as people look for ways to save on heating and cooking costs.

Group Manager for Prevention, John Amos said:

"Carbon monoxide is known as the silent killer as you can't see it, taste it or smell it.

"Poisoning from carbon monoxide can occur when any fuel-burning appliance, such as a boiler, gas fire or central heating system that has not been properly installed, maintained, or if there is a lack of ventilation.

"Make sure you have a working carbon monoxide alarm in the same room as any heating appliance which doesn't run off electricity."

### New CO regulations

Since 1 October, landlords in England have been required to provide carbon monoxide alarms for all rooms in the home where there is a 'fixed combustion appliance'; such as a fireplace or a boiler.

### What causes CO poisoning?

The build-up of carbon monoxide can be caused by any of the following:

- Boilers, gas fires, cookers, water heaters, open fires and central heating systems
- Using cooking appliances as heaters
- Faulty heating or cooking appliances
- Badly ventilated rooms sealed windows or no air bricks

### Spot the symptoms early

The early symptoms of CO poisoning can easily be mistaken for other common ailments and can develop quickly or over several days or months.

These include:

- A headache
- Feeling dizzy, sick, tired and confused
- Being sick and/or having stomach pain
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing

## Do you know the 5Cs and how you can keep yourself and your family safe this winter?



Candles - keep lit candles away from clothing and bedding and put them out before you leave the room

Carbon monoxide - ensure you have a CO alarm fitted in your home and look out for the early warning signs of carbon monoxide poisoning.

Cooking - barbecues and camping stoves are unsafe to use inside as it puts you at risk of carbon monoxide poisoning.

Chimneys - make sure you use the correct fuel for woodburning stoves and open fires to reduce the risk of toxic fumes and carbon monoxide poisoning.

Clothing - think about where you put clothes to dry and keep well away from portable heaters and fires.

## Do you have a Council Tax account?

Sign-up for an online Council Tax account. Having an online account will allow you access to your account at any time. You will be able to:

- Sign up to receive an e-Bill rather than a paper bill
- View bills online including the balance outstanding and see previous payments
- Request payment by or amend an existing Direct Debit
- Notify us of a change of address
- Make an arrangement to pay

## Help with your water bill

If you're struggling to pay your bill, you could be entitled to one of Southern Water's payment schemes.

You could be eligible for a discount if any of the following applies to you:

- Your household income is low
- Someone in your home gets a means-tested benefit
- You've got three or more children under 19 living at home
- Someone living with you needs more water because of a medical condition
- You haven't made a payment to us for a while

## **British Gas Energy Trust Support Fund**

If you are struggling to pay for gas and electricity bills, you may be eligible to apply to the <u>British Gas Trust</u> <u>Energy Support Fund</u> to clear energy debts. Grants of up to £1,500 are available to British Gas customers with fuel debts of between £250 and £1,500.

You must get money or debt advice before applying; there are local and national agencies offering online debt and money information.

## If you get benefits based on your income

The second and final part of the £650 Cost of Living Payment will arrive between Tuesday 8 and Wednesday 23 November 2022.

You will get the £324 payment if you receive:

- Universal Credit
- Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit
- Child Tax Credit
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Income Support

The payment will be made separately from your benefit.

## New Local Supported Employment service

Southampton City Council has secured funding to help adults with learning disabilities to find and maintain employment.

People with learning disabilities can face a variety of barriers when looking for work. The grant funding from the Local Supported Employment (LSE) initiative will enable the council to build on its existing work to support people into employment. If you ...

- Have a learning disability or autism
- Are aged 18 and over
- Claim Universal Credit or are economically inactive
- Are known to a team at Southampton City Council (e.g. Adult Social Care, Homelessness, Pathways Through Care etc.)

...then you could be able to get support from our team to find your next job.

The new initiative will run alongside our Learning Disability Employment Service that works with people with a learning disability who use the council's day services and/or are supported by the council's Learning Disability Team, as well as our Solent Get Into Employment (SGIE) project, which is part funded by the European Social Fund, that provides free one-to-one to support to help people with a <u>neurodivergent condition</u> to get into <u>employment</u> or volunteering.
