


Shirley Junior School Bellemoor Ro

Dear Parent/Carer,

This half term the children will be developing their 'to be curious' personal skill whilst deepening their understanding of our values: Respect, Integrity and Kindness.

Children will develop curiosity within their learning across the curriculum - asking questions, leading their own learning to find something out and developing their desire to discover new things.
