#### FREE SCHOOL MEAL FUNDING

Any families that are entitled to free school meal funding at Shirley Schools are also eligible for Pupil Premium funding - this is additional funding given to schools by the local authority, partly to make sure that there is no worry about the financial cost of school activities.

For families who are eligible for Pupil Premium funding, the school will pay for all day trips and events that occur in school that have a monetary cost. We will also pay fully for one residential that your child might attend whilst at SJS, because we believe residential experiences are so valuable. Currently, children in Year 5 spend 3 days at Minstead which links closely with their project learning, and Year 6 spend a week at Little Canada PGL centre on the Isle of Wight doing team-building type activities like climbing and go-karting.

To make sure that they can access extra-curricular activities, we offer children eligible for the Pupil Premium one after school club per term, and are happy to pay for peripatetic music lessons for one instrument.

If you would like to take advantage of any of these opportunities, all you need to do is come and speak to somebody in the office. You can rest assured that children will not be treated any differently in school, and will not need to be aware of any of this.

#### YEAR 2 RECORDER LESSONS STARTING

This half term our Year 2 children will be starting their recorder lessons every other week with Mrs. Clark. These lessons will continue throughout the year.

We will be playing <u>descant recorders</u> and we do have enough of these instruments in school for children to use in their lessons. #### **Guidance for Absence and Lateness**

Firstly, may we thank Parents and Carers who regularly ensure that their children attend school at all times. We understand that absence is sometimes inevitable and hope that you see this letter in the spirit of partnership and support that it is intended.

At Shirley Infant and Junior schools, we believe that children who have a high attendance at school have a better chance of achieving their academic potential, as well as developing good emotional health and positive relationships. School want to work in partnership with you to give your child/ren the best possible start in life.

As your child/ren are registered at our schools, it is our responsibility to work with you and your family to ensure that your child comes to school regularly.

In our schools we have a member of senior leadership who leads on attendance as well as your child's class teacher and our family support worker/attendance officer who are always happy to talk.

In the event of your child being absent, to support attendance we may:

- make daily contact with you to seek information on your child's well-being and reason for absence
- visit you at home as part of our safeguarding responsibility
- meet with you and your child to find agreed solutions to any barriers in attending
- make reasonable adjustments to help your child attend
- work with you to make a plan to include your child's voice in helping them attend
- seek outside agency help as needed
- keep records of any absence and reasons for absence
- inform the local authority if needed
- missing school can mean missing out.

Please come and talk to us if your child is having difficulties coming to school.

Research shows that absence from school, for whatever reason, can disadvantage a child by creating gaps in learning, which affect a child's ability to succeed. For example, it can be seen that at A-levels, there is a fall in grade for every 5% that attendance falls below 95%. As such, we monitor all absence and all attendance data is shared with the Local Authority. We will contact you if we have any concerns regarding your child's attendance.

Please make sure that you phone school by 9 am on the first morning that your child is absent from school and each morning after that.



## Safeguarding

Please be aware of an incident that occurred last Friday 16th September in St.James' Park after school hours.

A man was noticed on the exercise equipment videoing children on his phone. The man quickly put his phone away when he noticed a parent watching him and very quickly walked to the other side of that area. He was followed and challenged, and asked if he had just taken video of these children on the exercise equipment. He admitted he had and had two videos of them on his phone which he then deleted.

He claimed that he had videoed them as they "looked like lovely little girls" . The man's wife arrived and reported that he didn't understand and was new to the country. Both were Chinese. She claimed she was a teacher and he worked for the government. They had a couple of children with them.

The incident has been reported to the police and they would urge anyone else to report any similar incidents to the police if they happen again.

#### Child on child abuse

In line with Keeping children safe in education 2022 Child on child abuse includes, but is not limited to:

- Bullying (including cyberbullying)
- Abuse in intimate personal relationships between peers
- Physical abuse such as hitting, shaking, biting, hair pulling
- Online abuse, including facilitation, threats and/or encouragement of physical harm or sexual violence
- Sexual harassment, including sexual comments and jokes
- Consensual and non-consensual sharing of nudes and semi nudes images and or videos
- Upskirting, which typically involves taking a picture under a person's clothing without their permission

In 2022 the NSPCC reported a 29% increase in children seeking help with child on child abuse. We understand as a school:

- it often goes unseen in schools.
- it may take place online or away from school.
- It is frequently seen as 'banter' or 'kids being kids' in some settings.

At Shirley Infant and Junior School we ensure we train staff to notice the signs and understand the seriousness of child on child abuse. This is in our yearly training and refreshed training throughout the year. We uphold that dealing successfully with child on child abuse is a whole-school responsibility, starting with the headteacher. Our approach and view of 'it can happen here' is fundamental in all of our record keeping. We take all individual incidents seriously.

#### Tool kit for responding to allegations of child on child abuse

Any inappropriate behaviours that could be considered (as) 'bullying', will be taken seriously at all times. When written or verbal communications are received from a child/parent, whether for incidents occurring in school or offsite (such as via social media), these will be responded to in the following ways:

Any adult working in school will record any observed or communicated behaviour on CPOMs A member of staff will speak to the child/ren concerned using the agreed school approach to identify any concerns/worries Staff will observe child/ren in class and on the playground to identify whether the behaviours are deliberate, unwanted, ongoing and involving an imbalance of power. Is this incident considered 'bullying'? Consult with Senior Leadership Team NO 🛭 Ensure the incident is recorded on CPOMs and regularly Child's class teacher speaks to all parties involved. monitor the issue. Give children strategies to quickly report This is recorded on CPOMs. further concerns, e.g book/ key adult/worry box Head teacher will meet with parents of both parties. The offender is given the opportunity to correct their putting in place strategies to support, e.g ELSA, group behaviour, and a reflection sheet completed and shared sessions, and protective actions. with the offender's parents.
