My child says they are too ill to go to school. What should I do?

At Shirley Infant and Junior schools we expect children to attend school regularly. We know that children are ill and it is sometimes necessary for them to stay off school. It can be hard to know when to send your child to school and when they need to stay at home.


It is fine to send your child into school if they are a little under the weather, or had calpol in the morning. When deciding if your child is well enough to come into school you should ask yourself:-

- Would you take the day off work if you felt the same as your child?
- Is your child well enough to do the activities in school?
- Could your child manage to be in school for part of the day?

If your child comes to school and is then too unwell to stay we will phone you.

- My friend is off today
- I don't want to walk to school
- Another child is being horrible to me
- I don't like what we are doing at school today
- I am worried that I am going to get told off
- The work is too hard or easy
- My normal teacher is not in my class today

If you have any concerns please talk to your child's teacher, the teacher who is on the gate in the morning, or a member of staff in the office. We also have a family support worker, Karen Allen, who can support families in lots of different ways.

<u>Information regarding some common illnesses</u>

Coughs and colds





It's fine to send your child to school with a minor cough, common cold or runny nose. But, if they have a fever, keep them off school until the fever goes.

Encourage your child to throw away any used tissues and to wash their hands regularly.



Vomiting and diarrhoea

Children with diarrhoea or vomiting should stay away from school for 2 days after their symptoms have gone.

High temperature (above 38°C)

If your child has a high temperature, keep them off school until it goes away.



Coronavirus (COVID-19)



Your child should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people if they have symptoms of COVID-19 and they either:

have a high temperature (38°C or higher)

do not feel well enough to go to school or do their normal activities.

If they have tested positive we ask that they stay at home for 3 days and return to school when they feel well enough.

If they have mild symptoms and they feel well enough, they can still go to school.

Sore throat

You can still send your child to school if they have a sore throat. But, if they also have a high temperature above 38°C, they should stay at home until it goes away.

A sore throat and a high temperature can be symptoms of tonsillitis.

Headlice

There's no need to keep your child off school if they have head lice.

You can treat head lice without seeing a GP.

Safeguarding

Keeping our children safe online at Shirley Infant & Junior School



The school uses 2 layers of protection.

Firstly, Smoothwall is our content filter. This is highly effective at removing the vast majority of unpleasant or inappropriate sites.

Secondly, we use Senso to log keywords and allow live monitoring of student use across the classroom. There is no perfect system (although ours is very good) as the internet is evolving minute by minute and over blocking can lead to

false positives that prevent and disrupt learning.

We encourage the children to reflect on how they behave online and encourage responsibility in E-safety lessons and through whole school assemblies..

Star is Internet SMART. She knows that it is not right to share personal information with people online because they could be strangers!



Sonic is Internet ALERT. When researching online, he is quick to check the information with a grown-up to see the information is reliable.



Kitty is Internet KIND. She knows that being kind is always the best choice. Her motto is: "If you don't have anything nice to say, don't say anything at all."



Captain Brave is Internet BRAVE. The internet can be a scary place. He knows that it is always a good choice to share what you are doing with your grown-ups

Deciding what's appropriate for children to see online

The online world gives us access to a huge amount of information and services, but the scale of information available also means that there is content that is inappropriate for children. What is or isn't appropriate is up to individual parents and carers to decide, and could be based on things like age, ability, beliefs and family values.

What are parental controls?

Parental controls allow you to block and filter upsetting or inappropriate content. They work across your WiFi, phone network, individual apps and devices. Parental controls can help you to:

- plan what time of day your child can go online and how long for
- create content filters to block apps that may have <u>inappropriate content</u>
- manage the content different family members can see.



Useful information

Set up parental controls on Google Play:

- 1. Open the Google Play app.
- 2. At the top right, tap the profile icon.
- 3. Tap Settings Family. ...
- 4. Turn on Parental controls.
- 5. To protect parental controls, create a PIN that your child doesn't know.
- 6. Select the type of content that you want to filter.
- 7. Choose how to filter or restrict access.

Cost of Living Support

We're all worried about rising prices and the pressure that puts on household budgets.

The UK Government is providing a range of extra support which will be paid to eligible individuals automatically:



- Households in the UK will receive a £400 discount to help with the cost of their energy bill from October onwards.
- Also from October the Energy Price Guarantee will reduce the unit cost of electricity and gas so that a typical household in Great Britain pays, on average, around £2,500 a year on their energy bill, for the next 2 years.
- £650 Cost of Living payment for most people on means-tested benefits, the first (£326) has been paid and the second (£324) will be received in November.
- £300 Pensioner Cost of Living payment that will be paid with Winter Fuel Payments to all pensioner households across the UK.
- £150 Disability Cost of Living payment for those on an eligible UK disability benefit, paid from September.

Depending on where you live in the UK, there are different schemes that could help support your household finances:

- Help with your bills: such as low-cost home internet and phone packages available from providers, hardship schemes
 from water companies, and the UK Government funded Household Support Fund available from local councils to help
 with essential costs.
- Help with childcare: £2,000 a year of tax free childcare is available to eligible families to help with the cost of childcare.
- Help with housing: council tax support available from local councils and housing benefits are available from the UK Government.
- Help with your income: personalised job support is available through Job Help, tax relief and work-related expenses
 can be claimed from HMRC

Help with managing finances: MoneyHelper.org.uk offers impartial guidance and a range of tools to help make your money and pension choices clearer.
