Summer 1 Curriculum – The Power of Water

Next half term, we will be learning all about the power of water and how important it is around the world. During this topic, there will be a focus on Geography and we will look closely at different rivers around the world and the features that make up a river. The children will also be attending **Manor Farm** to have a closer look at the Hamble River and its features.

As part of the water theme, we will also be looking at the charity 'Water Aid' and what is being done to help those who don't have easy access to fresh, clean water. Towards the end of term we will be setting up and running our own fair to help raise money for water aid. Our Water Aid Fair will be held on the field on **Wednesday 1**st April this will be open to the rest of the school during the afternoon and it will be open at **2:30pm** to parents and carers.

Also, please could you send in any spare pennies or change that the children could use as a float when they come to run their stall in. For our literacy journey, we will be writing a newspaper article that focuses on the devastating impact flooding can have.

READING –We have already been very impressed with the amount of planners we are seeing filled in with reading reflections! Please keep it up as teachers are checking regularly. We expect the children to be reading x5 a week with two of these being detailed reading reflections.

SPELLINGS – Curriculum words (listed below) have already been sent home . Please encourage the children to learn these spellings throughout the next few weeks ready for a test in the final week of the half term. Please also ask the children, which spelling rule they are focusing on each week in their spelling lessons as they are important to learn too!

Homework –

Keep encouraging the children to complete their TT Rockstars, as we have already seen a massive improvement already this year! The teachers will be checking TT Rockstars every week and handing out paper copies to any children who have not completed it or do not have access to a computer at home.

P.E Expectations

A quick reminder children need to have PE kits in school at all times – For outside games lessons (Wednesday) children should wear plimsolls or trainers (no logos).
