Dear Parents,

Talking with children about what is happening in Ukraine

We wanted to share some resources that you may find helpful if you wish to talk with your children about the conflict between Ukraine and Russia.

Obviously you know your own child best, however the guidance we have seen for under 8s is to talk with them very generally if they bring it up in conversation, and to help them feel safe by letting them know that this conflict is geographically distant from them — maybe showing them on a map or globe.

Guidance for children age 8 and above is to listen to their worries and provide simple, honest, age-appropriate answers to their questions about what is going on. Don't avoid answering their questions about the situation as this could promote more anxiety, but keep to basic facts, and let them know that there is no right or wrong way to feel about this situation

FOCUS: Moving on to Year 1





Supporting Ukraine

Last night we lit the Clock Tower blue and yellow in solidarity with the people of Ukraine, who are currently suffering from the military aggression of the Russian State.

The blue and yellow national flag of Ukraine is also now flying outside the Civic Centre and the Guildhall will be lit blue and yellow from tonight.

Leader of the Council, Councillor Daniel Fitzhenry, said:

"We have all watched in horror these past few days at the awful situation in Ukraine, with the unprovoked attack on an independent democratic state.

"Southampton City Council is reaching out to offer support to Ukrainian citizens and their families in the city, and to those with links to other nearby Eastern European states who may be affected by this unfolding crisis.

"We also stand with the Russians who have made our city their home and those in Russia who are making their voices heard against their government.

"At times like these the people of Southampton always come together to support fellow residents and we've had many requests from people wishing to donate and help. We're signposting to the best ways to donate so please do check out our website and social media channels where we'll be promoting and amplifying the great work that's happening in our community to support the people of Ukraine.

"We pray for peace and our thoughts, hopes and best wishes go to all innocent people unnecessarily caught up in this tragedy."

How you can help

Many national and international aid organisations have set up appeals to help support and protect people caught up in this conflict.

You can make a financial donation to places like the British Red Cross or UNICEF via their websites.

The Home Office website details <u>support for family members of British nationals in Ukraine</u>, and Ukrainian nationals in Ukraine and the UK.

Locally the Polish Social Club are taking donations which will be sent to Medyka (on the Polish-Ukrainian border) from Southampton. They are asking for donations of:

- Nappies & wet wipes, including nappies for elderly
- Dry sanitary products
- Thermal clothes, gloves
- Batteries, flashlights, candles
- Food for children long term & dry
- Warm blankets, sleeping bags
- Painkillers and dressings
- Face masks & hand gels
- Dog/cat food

They kindly ask for all donations to be in a box, which will be stored and displayed in the Polish Club before being sent over.

Parenting with Anxiety: Helping **Anxious Parents Raise Confident** Children



What is the Parenting with Anxiety study?

I am Professor Sam Cartwright-Hatton who heads the Parenting with Anxiety study team at the University of Sussex. Our work is focused on developing tools and support to help parents who experience anxiety and reduce anxiety in children.

We are looking for 2,000 parents who experience anxiety to join us in testing an online course developed to give anxious parents skills and techniques to raise confident children.

Parents who get involved are not only helping Who can take part? us to test the course, they are contributing to

scientific research which will bring us closer to improving the lives of parents and children with anxiety.

What does taking part involve?

The course is made up of eight modules. They take about 20-30 minutes to complete and it is all done online, on your computer, tablet or smart phone. You can do it at your own pace and at a • Are able to commit your time to time that suits you.

You will also be asked to fill in a set of questionnaires at the start and again on two occasions over the next year and a half.

You can take part if you:

- Experience high levels of anxiety
- Have a child aged 2-11 that you see at least 50 days per year
- Are aged over 16
- Are a UK resident
- answering our questionnaires on three occasions over the next 18 months

Half of the parents who sign up for the study will be asked to complete this course and the other half will just be asked to fill in the questionnaires.

If you wanted to try the course, it may be disappointing to be in the control group, but you are still playing an essential role in our work in helping parents with anxiety. We value the contribution of every parent who takes part.
