PLEASE NOTE

From the 19th July Shirley Schools will continue to use the staggered start and end times. We know the government have said all restrictions will come to an end on the 19th July but we would ask that you continue to support us with our arrangements for the Risk Assessment for our school until the end of term on Friday 23rd July.

KEEPING US INFORMED

Please could we ask all parents to inform the school if anyone in the household is going for a coronavirus test or is self-isolating as another family member in the household has tested positive.

If your child is isolating please remember their Home Learning will be accessible on Google Classroom, if you have lost your login details please email the school office and we can get this arranged for you.

UPDATE FROM PUBLIC HEALTH ENGLAND

As an extra precaution Public Health England (PHE) is now advising close contact of anyone with a positive test result to get a COVID-19 PCR test (ideally 5 days after exposure or day five of isolation). If your child has had a positive PCR test within the last 90 days, you do not need to get another test unless they have new symptoms.





Grab your COVID jab at Oakley Road!

Anyone aged over 18 can now walk-in for their first or second COVID-19 vaccination at a Solent NHS Trust-run large-scale vaccination centre at Oakley Road in Millbrook, Southampton.

To use the walk-in vaccine service, people will need to arrive at Oakley Road between 8am and 7.30pm, Monday to Sunday.

Vaccines are offered on a first-come, first-served basis and there may be a short wait for people to receive their vaccine. People should bring their NHS number if they have it.

Second vaccinations are available at the walk-ins if it has been at least eight weeks since the first dose.
