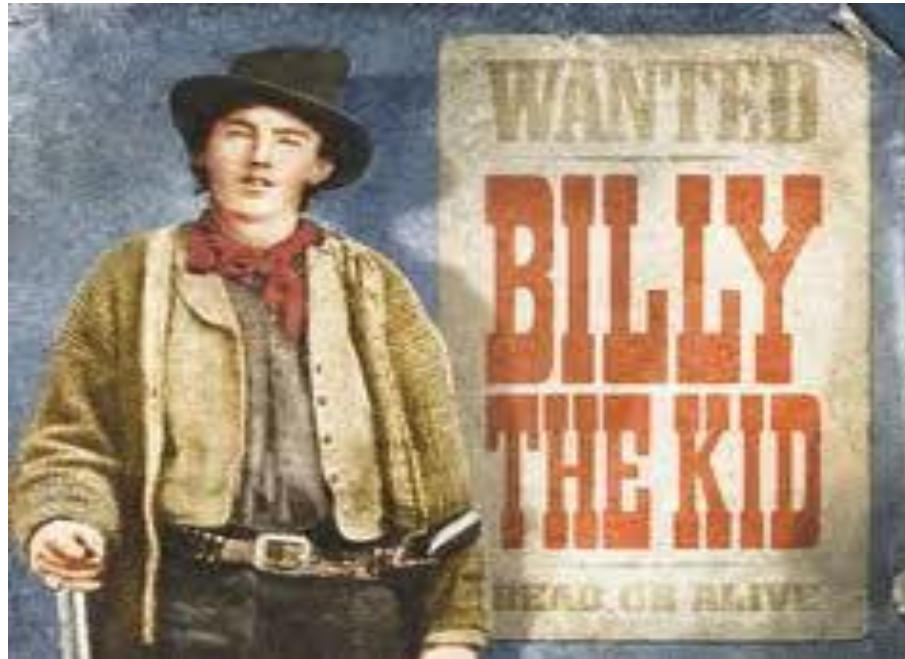


Outlaws in the Wild West



Outlaws

- An outlaw was someone who had broken one or more rules or laws.
- Outlaws ran away from being punished by authorities for their crimes.
- When they were on the run they were said to be 'fugitives at large'.
- Large rewards were offered for the capture of Outlaws.
- Authorities made wanted posters to help people find outlaws.

Outlaws



- The Wild Bunch were outlaws who robbed the Union Pacific Express train.
- Authorities offered \$10000 for their capture

The Wild Bunch



- The Wild Bunch was an organised gang of outlaws.
- Whilst they were on the run, the gang of outlaws committed many more crimes.
- The gang's leader was Butch Cassidy.

out.

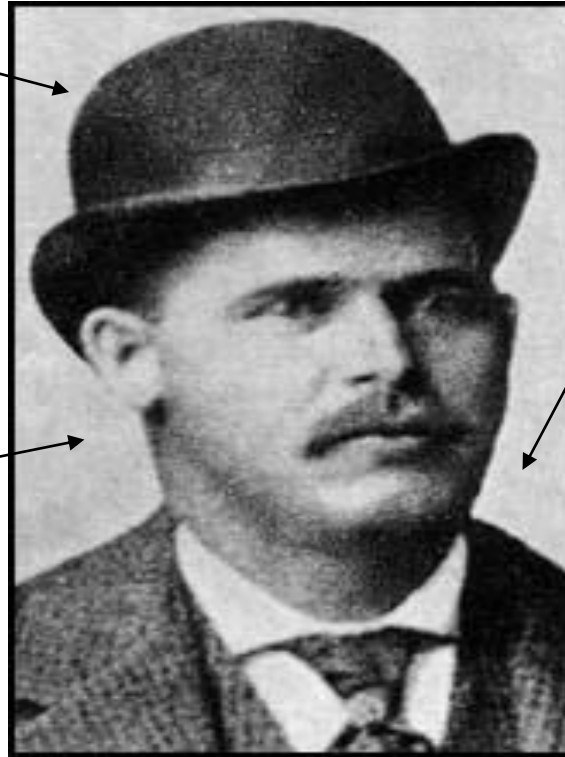


Robert LeRoy Parker

With Butch Cassidy, he performed the longest run of train robberies in American History.

Train and Bank robberies, but never killed anyone.



Nicknamed the Sundance Kid after he was captured stealing a saddle, pistol and horse from a ranch in Sundance.
