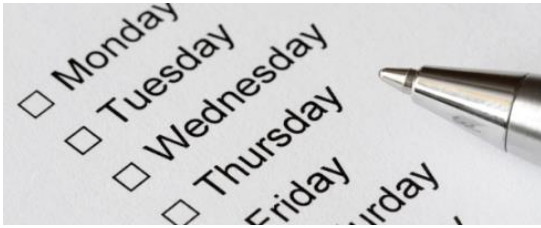
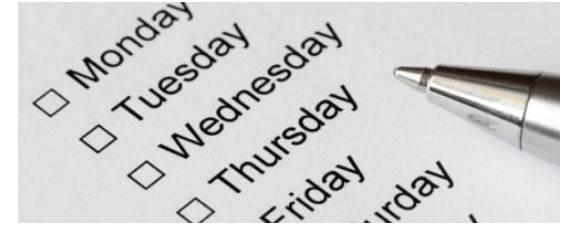

## RULES



**‘gue’**

‘gue’ makes a /g/  
sound but is spelt  
‘gue’

E.G. fatigue

**‘que’**

‘que’ makes a /k/  
sound but is spelt  
‘que’

E.G. antique

Can you think of any words which end with 'gue' or 'que'?

- Tell your adult or write them down (apart from antique and fatigue).

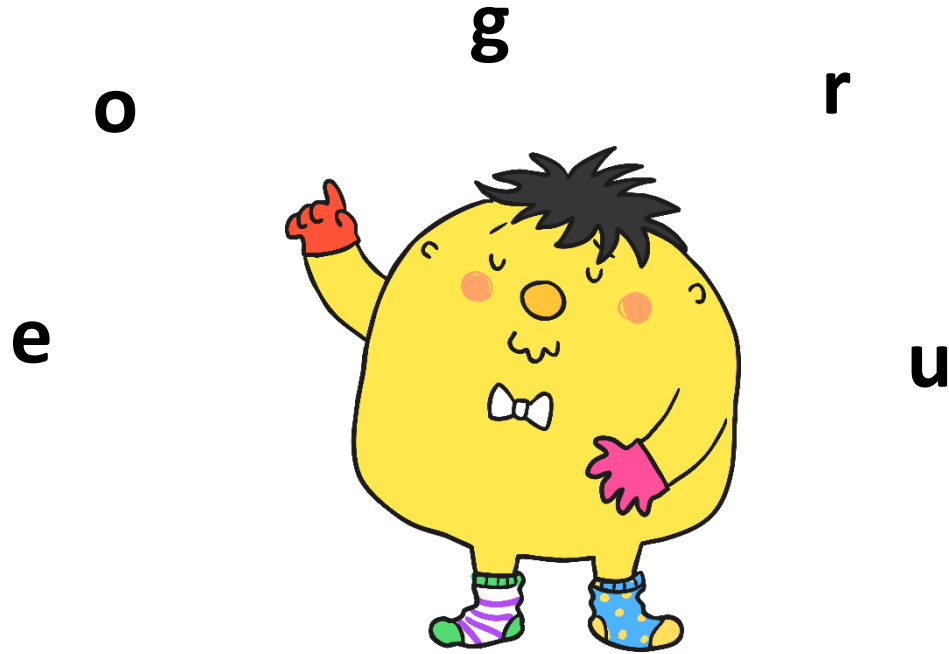

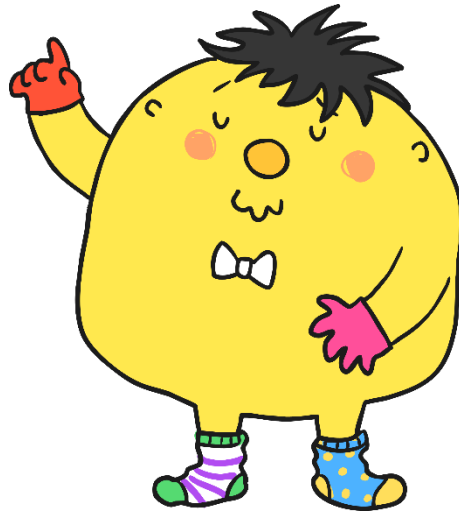
Answer is ... mosque

# These words mean...

- league = A group of clubs which play each other in a championship.
- tongue = The red fleshy organ in the mouth used for tasting and eating.

- mosque = A building of worship for Muslims
- technique = A way of carrying a particular task like a skill.
