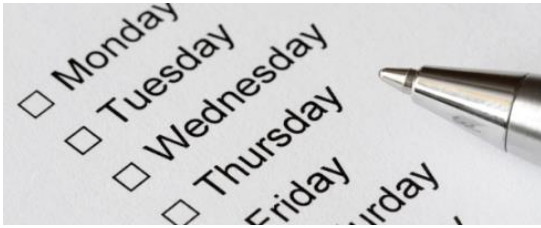
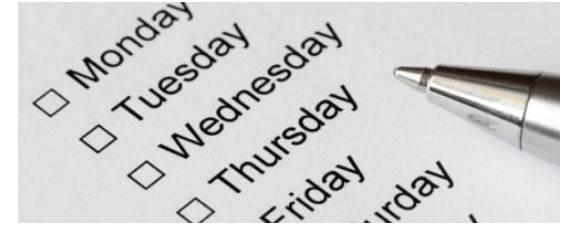

From last time, can you think of any words which end with 'gue' or 'que'?

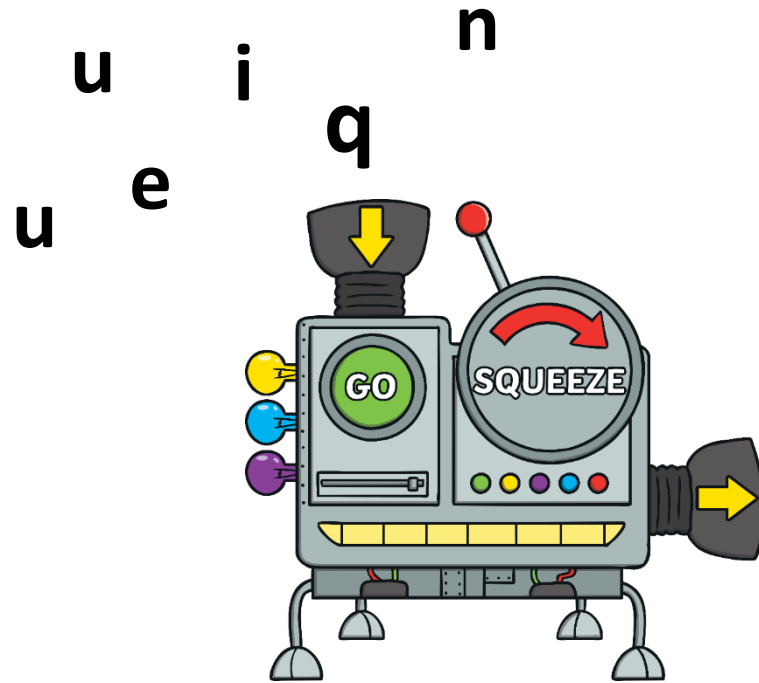

Can you remember what these words mean?
