




Welcome back to Home Learning Spellings with Mrs Andrews





This half term, is recap half term!

- This half term, we are going to recap the spelling principles that you either learnt with your class teachers or with me during your Home Learning. I will be referring you back to the previous Home Learning power points when we are discussing the spelling principles.
- This week we are going to focus on the prefixes 'dis' and 'un'.



What is a prefix?



- Let's remind ourselves what are prefixes by watching this BBC Bitesize clip.

- So a prefix is a letter or a group of letters added to the front of a root word to change the meaning of the word.
- They are not words in their own right!
- The root word always stays the same when the prefix is added to the front.
- There are many prefixes. In the Spring term you looked at many prefixes with your class teachers.
- What do the prefixes 'dis' and 'un' do the meaning of the word when they are added to the front of the root word?



Prefixes 'dis' and 'un'




- The prefixes <u>un- and dis-</u> either change the meaning of the root word to the exact opposite of its original meaning or mean not.
- REMEMBER: If the root word starts with the same letter as the end of the prefix the letter will be doubled.
- Can you think of any words which start with the prefixes 'un and 'dis'?
- Tell your adult.
- For example. disobey means the opposite of obey (or not to obey)
- prefix 'dis' + root word 'obey' = new word 'disobey'
- unhappy means not happy
- prefix 'un' + root word 'happy' = new word 'unhappy'






