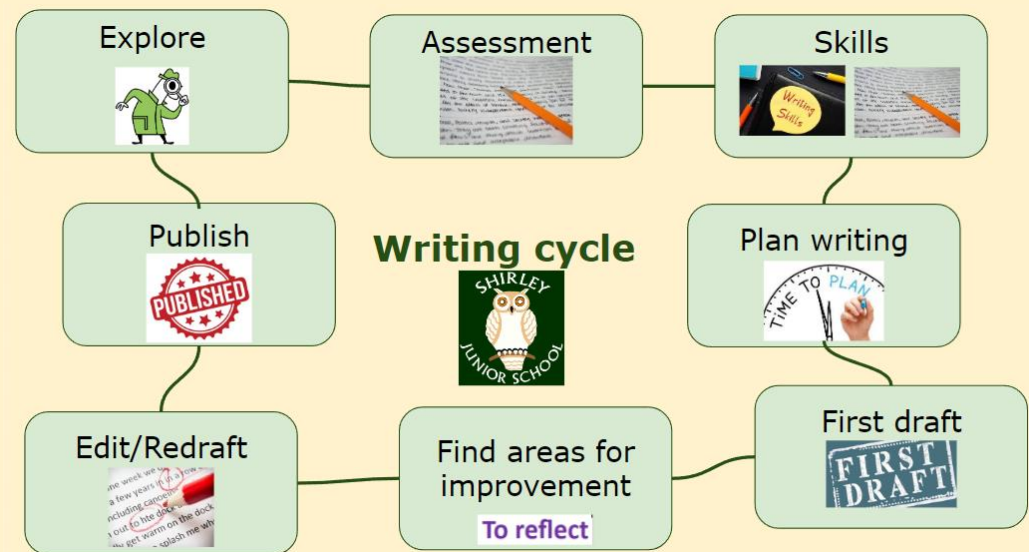
Three sustained writing opportunities throughout a writing journey.

Opportunities to write in a wide range of purpose and forms.



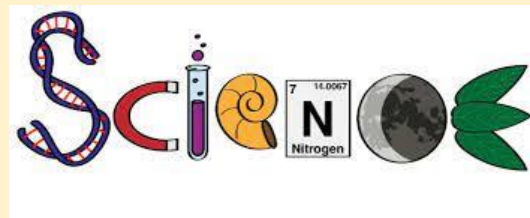
Maths

Daily arithmetic lessons teaching times tables - instant recall.

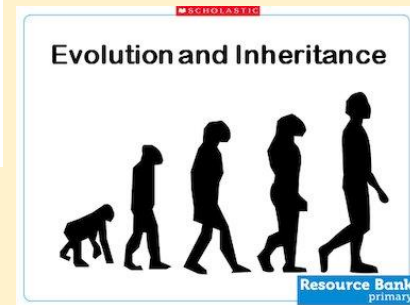
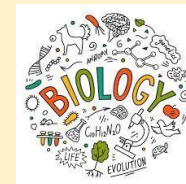
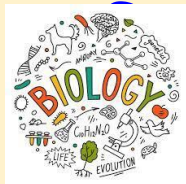
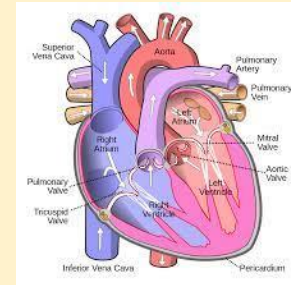
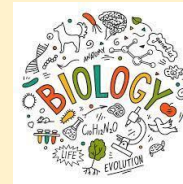
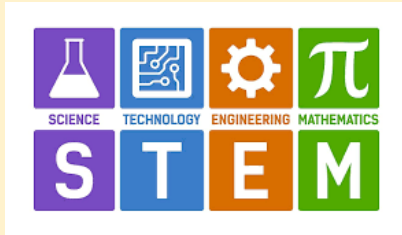


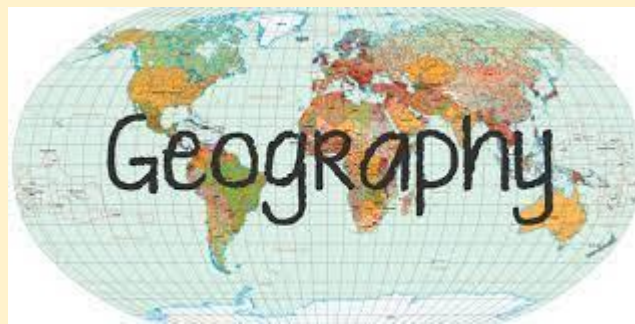

Reading Plus



- **Focus:** comprehension and language development
